

WHILE VILLEGAS WAS A VISALIA UNIFIED SCHOOL BOARD TRUSTEE, VUSD SETTLED FIVE SEX ABUSE CASES, SOUGHT TO “KEEP THE COMMUNITY IN THE DARK FOREVER”

SUMMARY

- When Villegas ran for a full term on the Visalia Unified School District in 2022, he advocated for increased transparency on the school board. However, between February 2023 and March 2025, Visalia Unified School District settled five (5) total sex abuse cases for a total of nearly \$15 million. Two of the cases received extensive scrutiny.
- November 2025: Visalia Unified School District reached a \$8 million settlement with a former student who alleged that she was groomed and sexually assaulted by a school staff member. The school member was described as a “textbook predator” who “victimized minor females essentially everywhere he’s gone in his life.”
 - According to the lawsuit, VUSD was accused of “negligent hiring, lack of supervision of an unfit employee and failure to report suspected child abuse.
 - The staff member was released from employment at the same school in 2013 for a “very serious misconduct,” but was rehired in 2022 as a campus supervisor.
 - Accuser’s attorney: the school “did everything wrong when they brought him back in 2022.”
 - A second student had accused the same person of abuse, and the Tulare County District Attorney had filed a total of 11 felony counts for misconduct against him.
 - We can surmise that it likely happened sometime between Sept. 23 and Nov. 5, 2025.
- March 2025: VUSD paid a \$3 million settlement to sex abuse victims that contained “provisions to keep the community in the dark forever” regarding details about the case. Six former students had accused a kindergarten teacher of sex abuse allegations.
 - Villegas was present for the Board of Education meeting during which the settlement was approved unanimously, in a closed session. The settlement was Visalia’s fifth secret settlement in the previous three years, and was “one of a flurry” of settlements that school districts were “quietly approving statewide.”
 - The \$3 million secretive settlement was part of a trend of using NDAs for reputation management, and discouraging people from finding out more information regarding the settlements through public records.
 - In this specific case, VUSD barred former students from receiving secret payouts from “directly or indirectly” encouraging others to file a request under the state Public Records Act.
- VUSD settled three other sex abuse and assault students between February 2023 and March 2025.



VUSD BARRED STUDENTS FROM BEING INCENTIVIZED TO ENCOURAGE OTHERS TO FILE PUBLIC RECORDS REQUESTS REGARDING THESE SETTLEMENTS

Visalia Unified School District “Barred Former Students Receiving Secret Payouts From ‘Directly Or Indirectly’ Encouraging Others To File A Request Under The State Public Records Act.” “In Visalia, confidentiality clauses negotiated by district lawyers acknowledged the public’s right to obtain the information – and then attempted to make sure they never would. 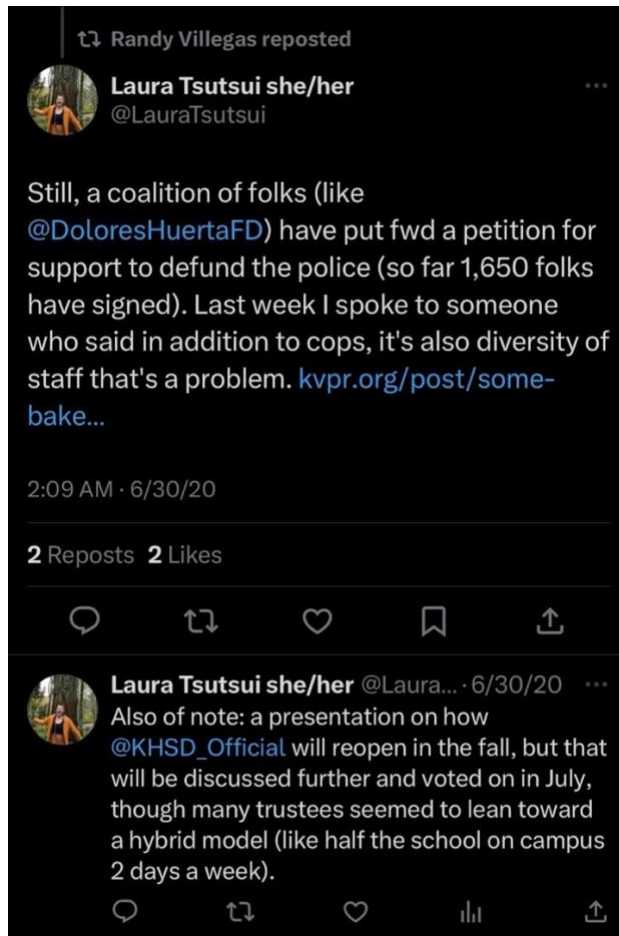
